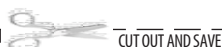

Parent's Corner

Children's Normal Sexual Development

It is common for children of all ages to display a certain amount of sexual behaviors/interest from infancy to adolescence. Sexual behavior is not in and of itself a sign that abuse has occurred. This table lists some of the behaviors common among children of different age groups.

Preschool (0 to 5 yrs)

Common:

- Sexual language relating to differences in body parts, bathroom talk, pregnancy, and birth
- Self-fondling at home and in public
- Showing and looking at private body part

Uncommon:

- Discussion of sexual acts
- Sexual contact experiences with other children
- Masturbation unresponsive to redirection or limits
- Inserting objects in genital openings

School Age (6 to 12 yrs)

Common:

- Questions about menstruation, pregnancy, sexual behavior
- "Experimenting" with same-age children, including kissing, fondling, exhibitionism, and role-playing
- Masturbation at home or other private places

Uncommon:

- Discussion of explicit sexual acts (look into how much adult material (videos, games, internet)
- Asking adults or peers to participate in explicit sexual acts

Adolescence (13 to 16 yrs)

Common:

- Questions about decision-making, social relationships, and sexual customs
- Masturbation in private
- Experimenting between adolescents of the

same age, including open-mouth kissing, fondling, and body rubbing

- Voyeuristic behaviors
- Sexual intercourse occurs in approximately one-third of this age group
- Oral sex has been found to occur in 50 percent of teens ages 15 and older

Uncommon:

- Sexual interest in much younger children
- Aggression in touching others' genitals
- Asking adults to participate in explicit sexual acts

Signs of Sexual Abuse

Below are only signs of a potential problem; they must be evaluated by a professional along with other information.

- Sexual knowledge, interest, or language that is unusual for the child's age
- Sexual activities with toys or other children that seem unusual, aggressive, or unresponsive to limits or redirection
- Excessive masturbation, sometimes in public, not responsive to redirection or limits
- Pain, itching, redness, or bleeding in the genital areas
- Nightmares, trouble sleeping, or fear of the dark (if this sign is present with others on this list)
- Sudden or extreme mood swings: rage, fear, anger, excessive crying, or withdrawal
- "Spacing out" at odd times
- Loss of appetite, or difficulty eating or swallowing
- Cutting, burning, or other self-mutilating behaviors as an adolescent
- Talking about a new, older friend
- Unexplained avoidance of certain people, places, or activities
- An older child behaving like a much younger child: wetting the bed or sucking a thumb, for example
- Suddenly having money, clothing, toys or electronics that you did not buy

				1 Wear a blue ribbon or plant a blue pinwheel (symbols of child abuse prevention).	2 Catch your child being good!	3 Spring is coming! Go outside. Discover what is starting to grow under the snow.
4 Put on your favorite music—have fun, dance and move to the music!	5 Allow your child to take time to think before making choices, when possible.	6 When groups of kids play, notice how different age children play differently.	7 Plan a game night with your kids and other family members.	8 Use a notebook to write down all the names and phone numbers you call. Keep this notebook.	9 Listen to your child's stories, dreams and ideas.	10 Relearn outside games such as Tag, Freeze Tag, Kickball, Red Light Green Light, Hide And Seek, SPUD, Duck-Duck-Goose, Football...
11 Encourage your child to give their allowance to charity.	12 For older children, encourage your child to join group activities, take a leadership role.	13 Learn when and how children usually learn to do things like walking, whistling, potty training etc. This will explain a lot.	14 Volunteer in your child's classroom or daycare.	15 Let your child pick out a book to read, use funny voices or tell stories together about the pictures.	16 Collect inexpensive games and place them in a box for you and your kids to play (cards, board games etc.).	17 Plan for next Saturday's family dinner. Ask what healthy foods they will eat.
18 Shop for next Saturday's Family Meal; invite a close relative/friend to help.	19 Don't forget to hug your child and let them know you love them, no matter what!	20 Ask your child, How was your day? Listen and this will mean a lot if the child has your full attention.	21 Look for responsible friends/family to share babysitting responsibilities. Remember to come home at the agreed time and don't overuse your support.	22 Visit services, resources, classes or child programs in your community.	23 Ask your child's opinion on topics you hear about on TV, radio, internet. Keep your child away from "adult material".	24 Have your family help make a Saturday dinner. Give jobs to each child that fits their age.
25 Go to the library and learn about resources. Public Library of Saginaw has a Community Resource page online.	26 Make sure your child has lots of interactions with other children.	27 Talk to your preschooler (older) about privacy. Use the words your doctor uses for private parts for all children.	28 Visit an older relative or friend with your child.	29 Keep all important paperwork for your children in one place that you can find.	30 Learn positive ways to discipline (such as time-out and discussion).
