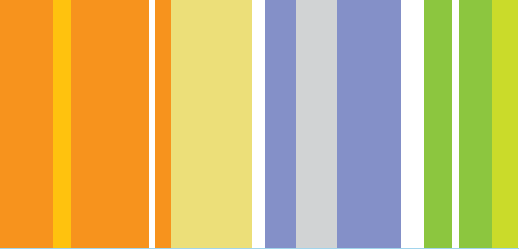

As you turn the pages of our 2008 Annual Report, please note our progress. The following highlights and more are covered inside:

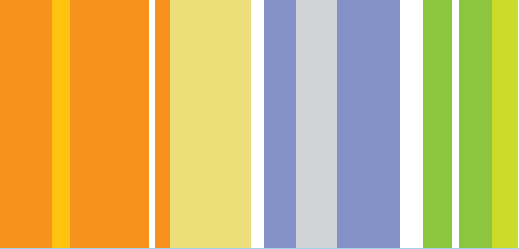
- Initiated the research and development of our newest prevention program—S.O.S.—Smarter, Older, Safer to replace the outdated Playing It Safe Program;
- Strengthened our partnership with Covenant HealthCare to provide experienced Registered Nurses to receive specialized SANE (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner) training in order to provide additional experts for medical examinations of our abused children;
- Managed and nurtured over 310 volunteers investing more than 8,715 hours to our mission;
- Facilitated Saginaw’s Great Start Collaborative—dedicated to the safety, success and well-being of all children birth to age 5;
- Responded successfully to increased demand for our Baby Think It Over program so that most weekends we are serving two high school classrooms;
- Selected President/CEO to serve as chair of the Zero to Five Advisory Network for Michigan and board member for the Michigan Nonprofit Association;
- Celebrated CAN Council Saginaw County’s Mardi Gras Auction revenue of \$97,517!

Awareness and Collaboration

CHILD ADVOCATE AWARD



Cheryl Courtney was named as the 2008 Child Advocate. For more than 30 years, Cheryl has been working tirelessly to protect the children in Saginaw County.

She has served in law enforcement (first female Saginaw Township Police Officer), as a forensic interviewer, a passionate church volunteer and respected law enforcement trainer.

PINWHEELS FOR PREVENTION



Prevent Child Abuse America is shifting awareness of child abuse from that of despair to one of hope. To incorporate this philosophy, they have adopted a 'Pinwheel'

for awareness to symbolize that "every child is entitled to a safe, happy home". The CAN Council will partner with PCA and utilize pinwheels in our public awareness and fundraising activities throughout the coming years.

'BATTERED SOULS' DISPLAY



A very moving exhibit of 997 pairs of children's shoes were displayed at Fashion Square Mall

during May. The shoes represented the number of children sexually abused, severely physically abused or neglected in Saginaw County in the previous year.

GRANTS PROVIDE ADVANCED TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES



The entire staff of the Children's Advocacy Center attended the 24th National Symposium on Child Abuse, the 20th Annual Crimes Against Children Conference and the 5th Annual Multidisciplinary Conference on Child Abuse. These advanced trainings were made possible through successful grant writing and scholarship opportunities.

PARENT EDUCATORS CONTINUE THEIR CRUCIAL WORK

The Healthy Families Saginaw Initiative (a collaborative of the CAN Council, Teen Parent Services, Michigan State University Extension and Saginaw Public Schools) was awarded a 3-year grant to continue providing intensive home visits to parents who are high risk for abuse and neglect. This \$250,000 annual grant award continues the successful HFS programming that has been providing services in Saginaw County since 1999.

ROOFSIT ROCKS THE COMMUNITY



Throughout the month of August, Bay and Saginaw communities in conjunction with Citadel Broadcasting joined forces to raise a record-setting \$27,836! This funding was used to help ensure that the Children's Advocacy Centers of both counties continue to provide a safe, compassionate place for children who are suspected of being abused to tell what has happened to them.

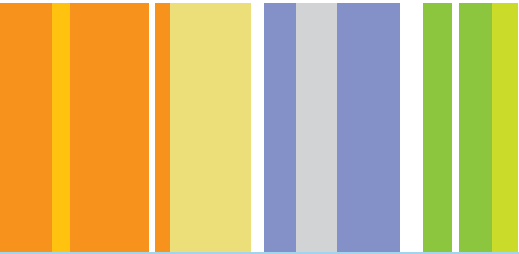
CAC RECEIVED A PROGRAM IMPROVEMENT GRANT

A grant was received from the National Children's Alliance (NCA) to improve the medical aspect of the CAC and enable the program to hire three registered nurses. Through this grant the CAC Director and nurses are able to attend training for Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) adult training and SANE pediatric training. Currently the CAC Director and one SANE nurse have completed both of the trainings and the other two nurses will attend the SANE pediatric training this summer/fall. This specialized nurses training will give the CAC as well as Saginaw County more nurses available to address not only adult sexual assault but also the child sexual assaults. There are only two trained for the pediatric sexual assault in this area, one of which lives in Bay City. This improvement will also help address the need for acute situations as well as to assist Dr. Frederick with the non-acute cases at the CAC.

GREAT START COLLABORATIVE NEWS



As a partner of the county's Great Start Collaborative, the CAN Council agreed to function as Content Manager and provide GSC website administration and weekly updates in providing valuable information to parents of children from birth through age five. This website continues to be updated for the FREE Preschool Partnership.



A REPORT FROM The Child Abuse Prevention Education (CAPE) Program

Program Mission: Working to prevent the cycle of child abuse through education, awareness and collaborative efforts in our community.

HIGHLIGHTS

Baby Think It Over Program

With the funding of the Frank N. Andersen Foundation, the Timbertown Dollology Club, and the HealthPlus Rainmaker grant, we were able to purchase 30 additional computerized infant simulators. This gave us the capability to present the program to twice as many students. The need to transport 60 infant simulators, however, can be a daunting task. Mobile Medical Response came to our rescue, donating a retired ambulance to us to help transport the simulators. In addition, the Dollology Club partnered with us to sew outfits for the simulators to demonstrate new safe sleep guidelines.

Baby Basic: Preventable Deaths Presentation

Our Baby Basic's program has become the standard presentation for most of the major community agencies that educate parents and child care providers. Collaborative presentations are given to the Covenant Baby Care and Babysitting Classes, MSU-E Better Kid Care Classes, Saginaw Valley Regional 4C's Classes and the monthly Baby Shower for the Department of Public Health.

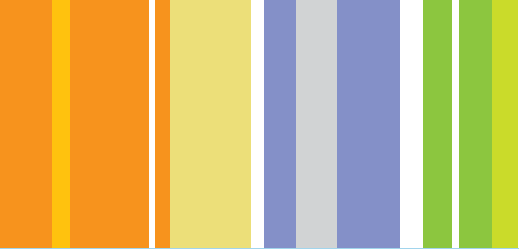
Personal Safety Material Created

Our CAPE program director authored a new personal safety activity book for parents and children focusing on taking abstract concepts and converting them into elementary reading levels and simple graphics. This summer it was field tested with children and parents. At the end of that process the pictures and text were again refined. The program was given a new name: SAFER – Older – Smarter: SOS. Schools were approached to approve and incorporate the program into their curriculum. The book will be piloted in schools in spring of 2009.

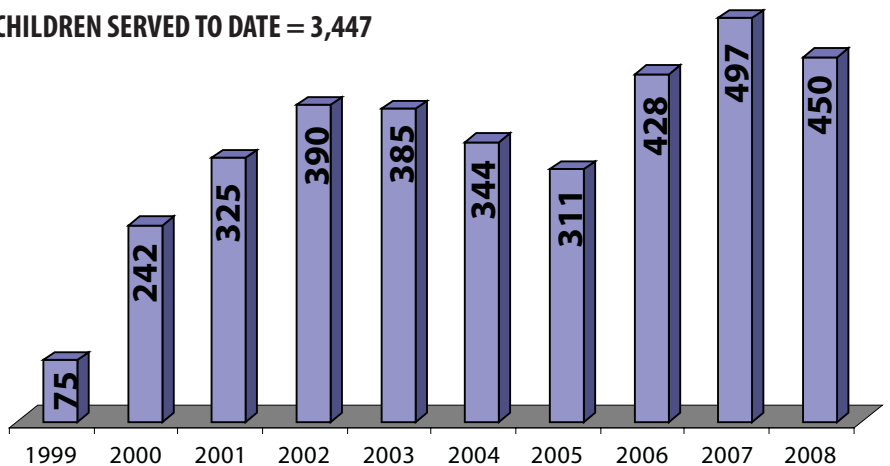

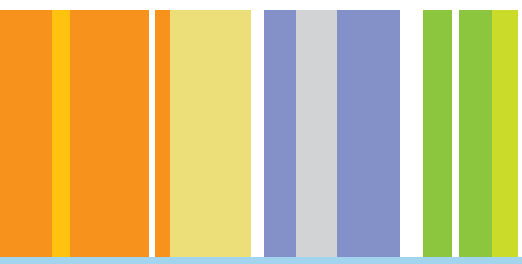

The Case Coordinator/Care Coordinator project was supported by Crime Victim Assistance Grant Award CVA 20690-9V05 awarded to the CAN Council Saginaw County by the Michigan Crime Victim Services Commission, Michigan Department of Community Health. The grant award of \$83,393 (80% of the project), comes from the Federal Crime Victims Fund, established by the Victims of Crime Act of 1984. The CAN Council provides the required match by the use of 977 volunteer hours valued at \$10,517 and a cash match of \$20,848 from the general fund.



A REPORT FROM THE The Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) Program

Program Mission: To provide highly trained volunteers as a powerful voice that advocates for a safe, permanent, loving environment for children who are in the Saginaw County court system because of abuse and neglect.

A Family Reunited:



Baby Meghan was five months old when she came into court jurisdiction. Her mother was not adequately taking care of her physical needs. She had her in a

bar with her, insufficiently clothed for the weather. She did not have appropriate housing or food for her. Meghan was placed in a foster home and a CASA assigned. The foster mother and the CASA worked intensively with the baby's mother on her attitudes and skills surrounding child care. The foster mother allowed very liberal visitation for the mother with her baby, which benefited both of them. The mother obtained a part-time job and adequate housing. Within just under a year, the mother was gradually able to obtain longer visits until she was finally able to **regain full custody of her daughter.**

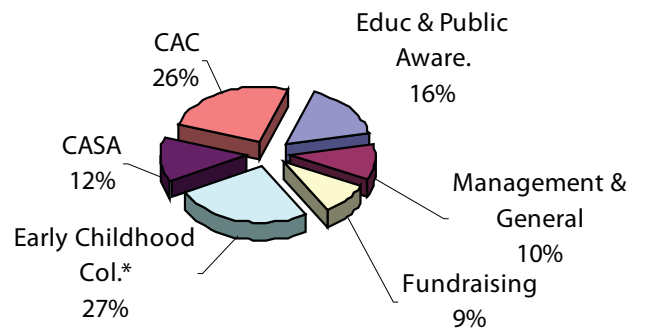

2008 OPERATING REVENUES



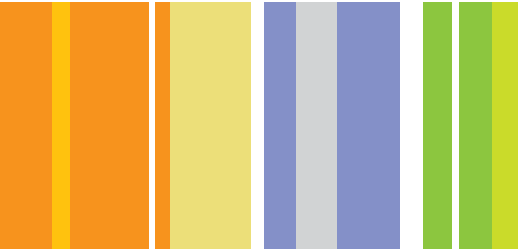
2008 OPERATING EXPENSES

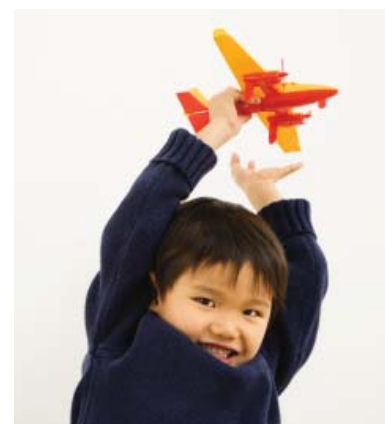

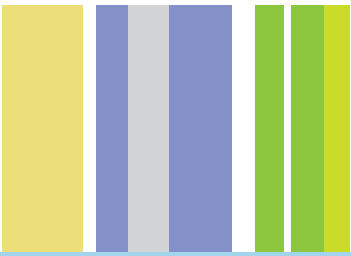
