Local Program Receives Community Awareness Project Funding for 2018 National Crime Victims' Rights Week

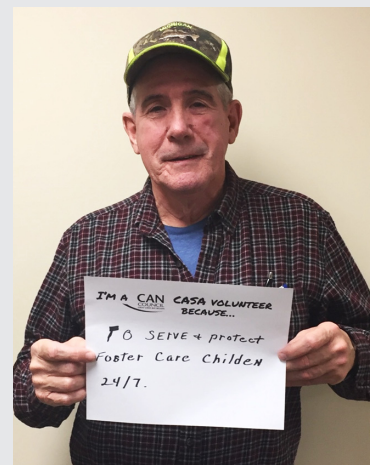
Volunteering with a Purpose

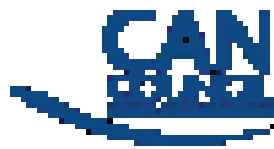

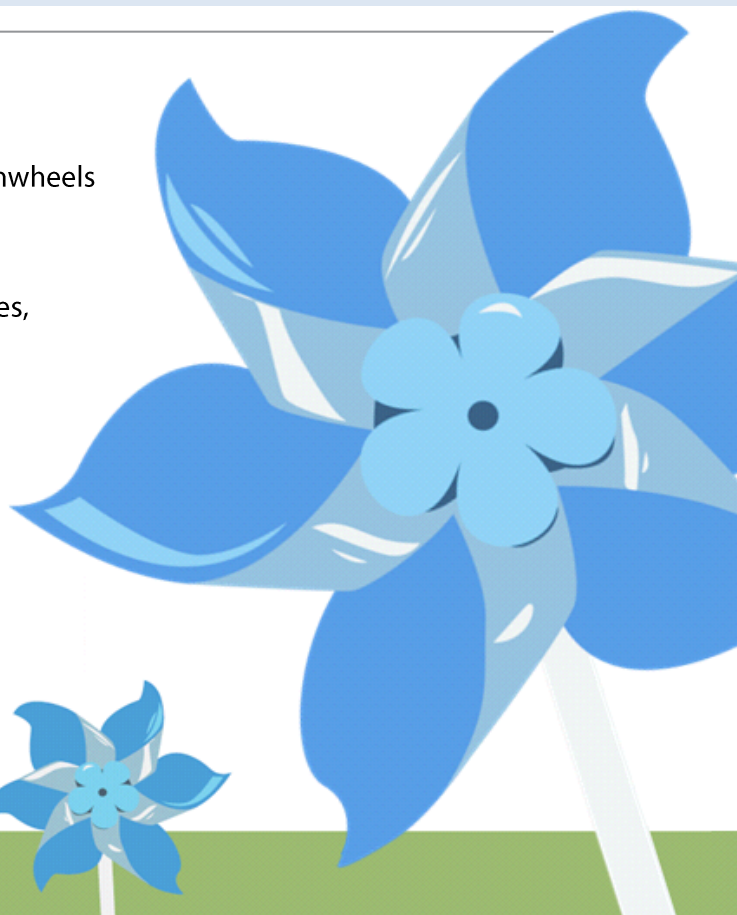
