# Welcome to 2017 CAN Council's New Year Resolutions

The CAN Council Great Lakes Bay Region experienced tremendous growth and expansions of our programs during the 2016 year. We are now better equipped and have more opportunities to advocate, intervene, and prevent child abuse and neglect.

Some highlights from 2016 include:

- **Expansion of CAC to Arenac County:** Located at the Community United Methodist Church in Standish, we are now able to provide Arenac County with the critical services needed for those children who have become victims of abuse and neglect.
- Implementation of the CASA Fostering Futures program: Fostering Futures is part of our Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program that focuses on assisting children aged 14-21 as they prepare to 'age out' of the foster care system.
- Expansion of CAPE programs, offering new parenting series through community collaborations: Partnered with Bay-Arenac ISD to offer a new evidenced-based parenting series, "Make Parenting A Pleasure".

During the last quarter of 2016, the CAN Council staff also saw an expansion. The CAN Council assisted the City of Saginaw Police Department with the implementation of a new position, a Victim Services Coordinator. Our own **Tammie Filipiak** was given this opportunity and has transferred her office to the Police Department.

With Tammie joining the Police Department, our former CAPE Prevention Education Coordinator, **Haylie Oldenburg**, moved into the vacant CAC Case Coordinator position and we hired a new CAPE Prevention Education Coordinator, **Megan McCoy**. During this time of internal changes, CAN was able to add **Vickie Stuart** to the staff to serve as an occasional CAC Forensic Interviewer. Vickie has received formal training, and we are excited to have her join our team.

Each of these changes enables the CAN Council Team to better respond to the needs of our community's children and families.

### PRESIDENT'S POINT OF VIEW

As 2017 begins, the CAN Council Great Lakes Bay Region is excited to share news that we believe will move our mission forward, "building communities where children are free from abuse and neglect". Each of these projects has been in the planning phase and will begin in 2017:

Website Redesigned: In February, our yearlong effort to redesign our website will be completed. The site, www.cancouncil.org, will include increased accessibility to relevant



information, testimonials, volunteer opportunities, programming, and more. Watch for the announcement in the next couple of weeks!

*Make Parenting A Pleasure*: In the fall of 2016, our team applied to the Children's Trust Fund (CTF) for the ability to serve at-risk, highlystressed families so that they can successfully keep their family together while improving their parenting and the lives of their children. This demonstration project will happen in 2017!

**CAC Medical Program:** In 2017, the standards for our Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) will now recommend that all children who receive a forensic interview be offered a medical exam. Having this requirement in our national standards required the recruitment and selection of a new Medical Director, as well as a team of SANE (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner) nurses and practitioners, led by Pediatric SANE Nurse, Tammie Gillespie.

During this year, our Public Awareness Team and Board of Directors have chosen to focus on our growing Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program. The CASA program requires volunteers to improve our response to the needs of children. Please call us to discover the ways you can connect and begin training to become a CASA in 2017 – we need you!

To each one of you who are already involved with our team, thank you. Your tremendous commitment to our mission and critical work is recognized – we couldn't do it (and wouldn't want to) without you! Your generosity has enabled us to end 2016 and start the new year ready to begin the recruitment, orientation, and retention of our volunteer team.

# Judy Zehnder Keller Named 2017 Child Advocate of the Year

Since 2000, the CAN Council's *Child Advocate of the Year Award* has annually honored an outstanding individual or group for being extraordinarily committed to making the Great Lakes Bay Region a better place for children. At this year's 24th Annual Mardi Gras Auction, the CAN Council will honor **Judy Zehnder Keller** as the 2017 Child Advocate of the Year.



Judy Zehnder Keller is the President and Owner of the **Bavarian Inn Lodge & Conference Center** in Frankenmuth, which she designed and built in 1986. Now in its fourth generation of active management, the Bavarian Inn Corporation is something Judy has been a part of since childhood.

Judy is married to Don Keller and resides in Frankenmuth. They have three grown children and four grandchildren. She is a passionate and committed advocate for the well-being of children. Daily, Judy is involved in making sure the needs of her family and staff are met.

Currently the Bavarian Inn Lodge & Conference Center has 360 guest rooms, meeting and banquet space for up to 500 guests, four indoor pools, two water slides, three whirlpools, an indoor 18-hole mini golf, expansive Family Fun Center with over 150 arcade games and redemption area, weekly Sunday Brunch in the

poolside courtyard, two restaurants, lounges, gift shops, tennis courts, exercise facilities, and is adjacent to the Heritage Park and running trails.

When asked about her profession, Judy proudly said, *"I fry chicken and make beds for a living"*.

Judy has been a longtime supporter of the CAN Council and the mission to *"build communities where children are free from abuse and neglect"*. ### CAN Council's Presence at Saginaw Police Department



The **Saginaw Police Department** has been working on a grant process for nearly two years to secure a new position, Victim Services Coordinator. The grant, ELERV (Enhanced Law Enforcement Response to Victims), has been awarded to three police departments throughout the country from the **U.S. Department of Justice** in partnership with the **International Association for Chiefs of Police (IACP)** and Saginaw is one of these recipients.

**Tammie Filipiak** of the CAN Council Great Lakes Bay Region is working with the Saginaw Police Department as the new Victim Services Coordinator. With Tammie in this newly-established position, she works to enhance relationships with the community and network with local agencies. Tammie's duties include contacting

victims or their family members within 24-48 hours after an initial incident, reviewing their case, and advocating for them by providing information on the next steps including what resources and services are available to them.

## **Make Parenting A Pleasure**

Being a parent is one of the most challenging and rewarding jobs one will ever have. It's often said that babies should come with an instruction manual! Without instructions given at birth, every caregiver develops their own style of parenting. The CAN Council, in collaboration with the **Bay County Great Start Collaborative**, is excited about offering parents the opportunity to share tips that they find work for them as well as to learn from others with the *Make Parenting A Pleasure* series.



This program is a starting point – where parents can learn more about their parenting styles, options for guiding their children, and gain greater confidence in themselves as parents and individuals. The purpose of the program is to:

- Encourage participants to take a closer look at their lives and the ways they relate to their children;
- Discover a broader range of positive and effective parenting as well as coping alternatives;
- Develop a social support network with other parents.

Being embedded with protective factors, parents involved in *Make Parenting A Pleasure* will learn the importance of taking care of themselves so that they can better care for their children. They will learn:

- Practical stress management and communication skills;
- How to gain a greater understanding of their child;
- Effective parenting skills and positive approaches to discipline.

*Make Parenting a Pleasure* is a 12-week, evidence-based program for parents of children 0 – 8 years old. Each session lasts two hours, and participants will be provided a meal and a weekly incentive for attending.
