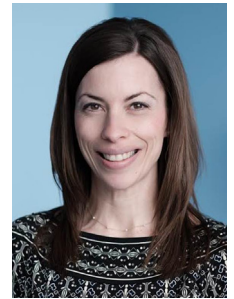

Beyond the Basics: Advanced Peer Review and Self-Review Strategies for Forensic Interviewers

Since 1999, the **National Children's Advocacy Center (NCAC)** has provided "Forensic Interviewing of Children" training to thousands of professionals from all 50 states and 12 foreign countries, as well as personnel from the Navy, the Marine Corps, the Air Force, and non-governmental organizations. Many other participants are involved with children's advocacy centers, law enforcement, child protective services, medical services, legal agencies, and therapeutic practices.

Current research suggests that, in addition to training and supervision, peer review and self-evaluation are necessary to maintain and improve preferred forensic interviewing practices. Knowing the importance of this, the CAN Council hosted "*Beyond the Basics: Advanced Peer Review and Self-Review Strategies for Forensic Interviewers*," a workshop that taught participants to develop techniques in the areas of enhanced rapport-building, narrative event practice, question strategies, victim blaming issues, quality versus quantity, reluctant youth, and presentation of evidence.

On March 15th, **Julie Kenniston, MSW, LSW, Program Manager, NCJTF/FVTC**, presented to nearly 30 registrants in attendance from all over the state including CAN Council's very own **Morgan Candela, Haylie Oldenburg, Vickie Stuart, and Cindy Morley**. Thank you to **Olga Mathis, CACmi Program Director**, for organizing this excellent training opportunity!

The training will consist of 30 hours of instruction at the CAN Council office and 6 hours observing court proceedings, all culminating with a swearing-in ceremony. This training is for community members interested in advocating for children from either Bay or Saginaw County.
