You truly are champions for our children, and you have our greatest appreciation.

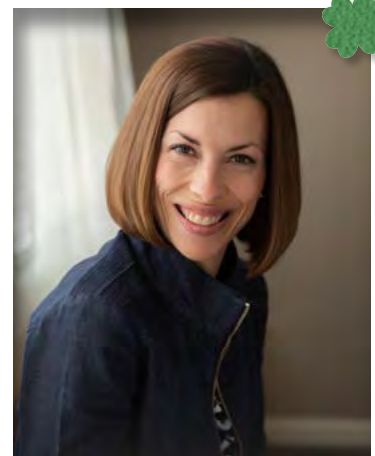

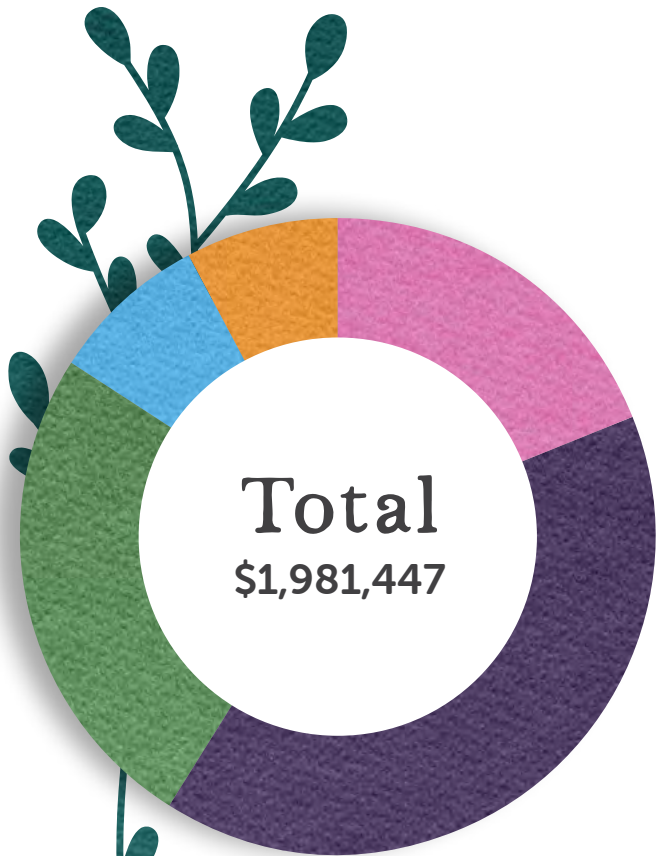

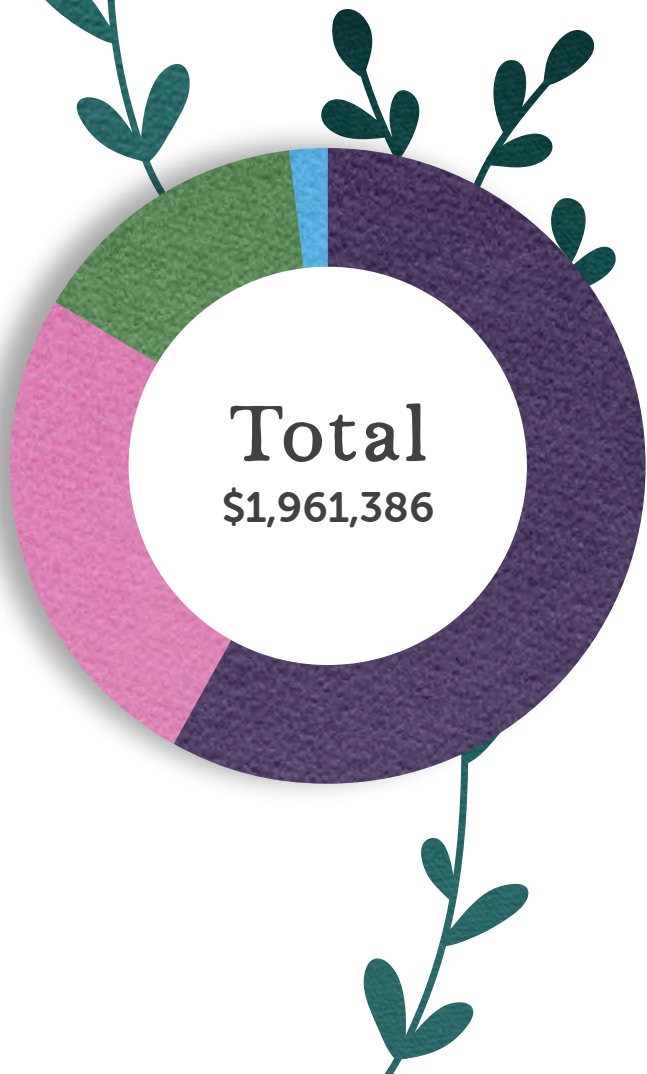

2020 totals:

2,876 people participated in **620 presentations, classes and events** in Arenac, Bay, Huron and Saginaw counties, totaling **9,636.5 hours** of prevention education programming.

A program for expectant parents and parents with babies up to 1 year old; offers helpful child-rearing education and information about available resources in Bay and Saginaw counties. For 2020, the program moved online, and community partners created educational videos to share information with participants. Participants took part in an online scavenger hunt at the end of the weeklong virtual event and received parenting support based on the family's specific needs. Items such as car seats, pack and plays, sleep sacks, diapers, wipes, learning toys, nursing pillows and baby monitors were distributed to participants.

In response to increased diaper insecurity due to the pandemic, the CAN Council established a Diaper Distribution Program open to families experiencing hardship. Through this new program, more than 187,500 diapers were supplied to families in our four counties.

Maintaining connections

To ensure that the CAN Council's CAPE programming and collaborations continued to reach our communities, our educators:


- Created video versions of our youth programs, Stewards of Children program, and several Make Parenting a Pleasure topics for distribution via our Facebook page, collaborative partners and constituents
- Co-hosted several Parent Cafés with Great Start Collaborative, connecting with 45 parents and providing support, guidance and education
- Facilitated a Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Workshop led by Nate Sheets, educating 117 parents and caregivers
- Co-hosted a Protective Factors Training with Great Start Collaborative, reaching 25 people
- Appeared on the Telepractice Today podcast to discuss recognizing signs of abuse through virtual means and how to respond
- Created a car seat installation video in collaboration with Garber Automotive

Census campaign success

The 2020 Census Public Awareness Campaign consisted of 3 events reaching 22 people, resulting in a total of \$39,600 (\$1,800/ participant) being secured for our community. This initiative was of utmost importance to the CAN Council, as the Census results help direct funding to programs and services that keep our local children safe.

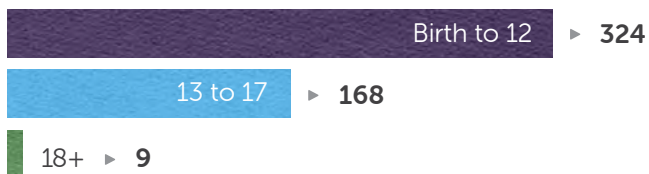

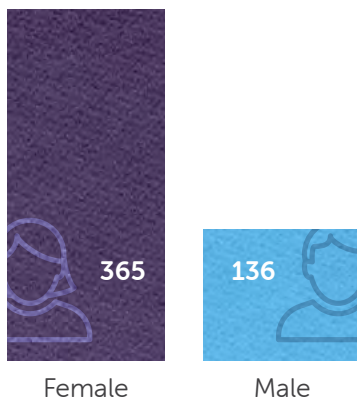

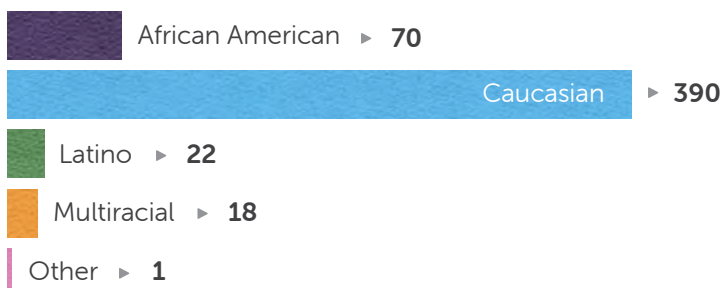
Age of victim



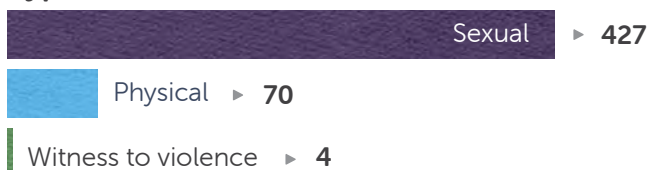
Gender of victim



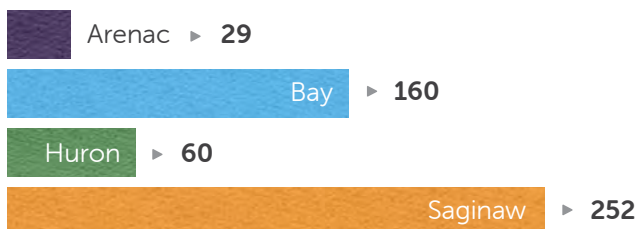
Ethnicity of victim

Medical program growth

The CAC Medical Exam program saw continuous growth throughout 2020, welcoming both a Medical Advisor and a Forensic Nurse Manager to the team. In a safe, child-friendly environment, the Saginaw County CAC conducts expert medical exams for children who have experienced abuse.

Proactive in the pandemic

As the COVID-19 pandemic took hold, we were proactive in ensuring that the essential functions of our CACs continued, with all possible safety precautions in place. Forensic interviews were conducted on an emergent basis, and case reviews became virtual. The community supported our efforts by supplying the personal protective equipment we needed to continue operations: Volunteers sewed hundreds of facemasks for our children and families, local companies supplied exam gowns to our Medical Exam program, and many generous donors contributed sanitizer and disinfectant wipes.

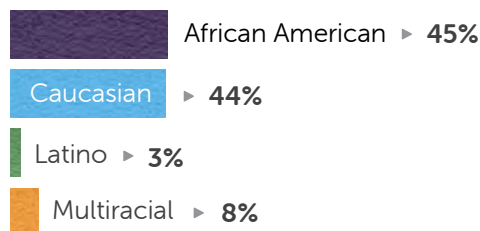

Consistent, caring & creative

Children who are in the foster care system due to abuse or neglect count on the consistent and caring adult presence that a CASA volunteer provides. Whether connecting online or via phone, making porch drop-offs of care packages, snail-mailing coloring pages, or playing board games virtually, our CASAs found many creative ways to remain constant fixtures in the children's lives despite the limitations of the COVID-19 pandemic.



Safely staying connected

When it was safe to do so, we encouraged outdoor in-person visits between CASA volunteers and children and provided the necessary personal protective equipment to all involved. Protocols were established to allow the volunteers and children to resume their critically important in-person visits while keeping everyone safe and healthy.



Pressing on in a pandemic

CASA volunteer recruitment and training continued in 2020, with trainings conducted virtually. Our CASAs also continued providing their critical testimony during virtual court hearings.

Court Appointed Special Advocates Program was supported by VOCA Services to Underserved Victims of Crime CVA#21300-4V18 awarded to the Child Abuse and Neglect Council of Saginaw County by the Michigan Crime Victim Services Commission, Michigan Department of Community Health. The grant award of \$175,058 comes from the Federal Crime Victims Fund, established by the Victims of Crime Act of 1984. The Child Abuse and Neglect Council of Saginaw County provides the required match by the use of volunteer hours valued at \$43,765.

CAN's pandemic pivot

Protecting children & serving families in the face of a global health crisis

While our organization was assembling business continuity plans for our programs, purchasing sanitizing supplies and sourcing personal protective equipment in preparation for the pandemic coming our way during the first quarter of 2020, our greatest concern was how the anticipated shutdown would impact children living in abusive or neglectful situations.

Knowing that the plight these children already faced during "normal" times would become exponentially more dangerous while constantly with their abusers during Stay Home orders and school shutdowns, we feared greatly for them.

Without the presence and intervention of schoolteachers or daycare providers – who are legally mandated to report suspected abuse – we worried about how abuse or neglect would be detected, what additional trauma these children would endure, and how they'd survive.

Being prepared to protect them was our driving force.

- Mitigating potential transmission of COVID-19 in our buildings became standard operating procedure for our entire staff.
- Having a backup interviewer available to conduct forensic interviews of abused children became paramount.
- Finding innovative ways for our Court Appointed Special Advocates to safely continue meeting with the children they serve became a necessity.
- Safely visiting the homes of the parents we educate became crucial so we could ensure they had the connectivity and tools necessary to continue engaging in our parenting classes as the programming transitioned to a virtual format.



Beyond maintaining programming, we also initiated *new* programming by way of diaper distribution throughout our entire region. We recognized that the economic challenges of the pandemic intensified unemployment and underemployment for many – and that, ultimately, these hardships could leave parents making difficult choices between paying bills, buying groceries and purchasing diapers. A baby left in a soiled diaper can cry uncontrollably and is at risk for infection, and the



stress of such scenarios on an already frustrated parent sets the stage for potentially dangerous consequences. With the help of WNEM TV-5 and a community of givers, we raised enough money to provide diapers to all who needed them throughout 2020.

To keep all these engines firing, our administrative team, Board of Directors, and volunteers launched a year full of virtual fundraisers. They adapted quickly to the circumstances – as they always have.

Responding to the needs of our community by strengthening services, creating new programming and building awareness of the issues surrounding child abuse has all been our mission for 40-plus years. While we're excited for "normalcy" to resume, what we've learned through this pandemic will shape our service delivery into the future, ensuring our presence and strength for each child who needs us.

Reaching a milestone, making an impact

CAC program surpasses 10,000 children served

Our Children's Advocacy Centers (CACs) reached a milestone in 2020, having served more than 10,000 children since the doors opened in 1999. This extraordinary number is a testament to the tremendous need for these services in our communities.

The purpose of the CACs is to provide a safe, supportive environment in which a child who has been physically or sexually abused or has witnessed a violent act can be interviewed and examined.

Each child who enters our facilities is facing a traumatic experience that warranted a referral by law enforcement or Children's Protective Services (CPS). Our CAC staff interviews the child and provides medical exams, victim advocacy, case management, referrals for counseling and other critical services.

Before the CACs existed, a child could have been interviewed by as many as 13 different professionals in a variety of locations – in the back of a police car, at school or even in the emergency room. With the creation of the CACs, this all changed for our communities. A child is now interviewed in one place – a child-friendly environment – only one time, by a specially trained forensic interviewer.

Each interview at a CAC is observed on a closed-circuit television or through a one-way mirror by members of a multidisciplinary team that includes law enforcement, the Department of Health and Human Services, medical professionals, mental health professionals, local prosecutors, victim advocates and other professionals. Based on their observation of the interview, the team members collaboratively make decisions about how best to help the child.

The multidisciplinary team's response is the core part of the work of the CACs. These dedicated professionals work together in the best interest of each child, walking the children and their families through each step of the experience and guiding them down the road to recovery.

"Our multidisciplinary team works together to provide critical services for children and families who have gone through a traumatic experience," said CAC Program Director Cynthia Morley. "As a team, we can make a difference, one child at a time."

The services offered by our CACs have made an incredible difference in the lives of each of the 10,000-plus children who have passed through our doors. Being able to provide this level of care to these children and their families truly is at the heart of the CAN Council's mission and would not be possible without the dedicated support of our communities.

2020 Child Advocate of the Year



Suzanne
Greenberg

A passionate and visionary leader, Suzanne grew the Child Abuse and Neglect Council of Saginaw County from a staff of two and a budget of \$38,000 in the basement of Westlund Guidance Clinic in 1995 to a staff of 22 and a \$1.6 million budget to serve the 65,000 children of Arenac, Bay and Saginaw counties as CAN Council Great Lakes Bay Region by 2019.

In Suzanne's early years with CAN, the organization's focus was on building the community's awareness about child abuse and developing programming to prevent it. She spearheaded creation of Playing it Safe and S.O.S. – Safer, Older, Smarter for second graders; Baby Basics for childcare providers and future parents; a sexting awareness program for middle schoolers; and Safe Baby, which became America's largest program of its kind for high school students.

Over the years, Suzanne led development of customized programming for the faith community, mandated reporters and potential jurors. She also launched CAN Council's parenting program, bringing evidence-based education and support to our region's parents.

She championed adoption of the local Children's Advocacy Center to ensure stability of its critical intervention work for abused children. Then, in partnership with the Family Court judge, Suzanne worked to create, fund and launch the Saginaw County Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) program.

With hopes of broadening the CAN Council's regional impact, Suzanne led the affiliation of Saginaw County and Bay County prevention and intervention programming to form CAN Council Great Lakes Bay Region in 2011. Soon after, with the support of the Family Court judge, she led expansion of the CASA program into Bay County.

Recognizing the need for facility enhancements to provide superior security and privacy for children and families – and to serve the community even more efficiently – Suzanne led a team of community volunteers in a \$3 million capital campaign that launched in 2013. Renovation and expansion of the CAN Council's Saginaw campus was completed in 2015. Then, in 2016, a satellite location of the Children's Advocacy Center opened in Arenac County.

Always looking ahead to CAN's future, Suzanne established funding strategies and succession plans. She created and grew endowments for Saginaw and Bay counties. And she always took great pride in coaching and mentoring CAN's future leaders, as well as emerging community leaders.

In early 2019, Suzanne left the CAN Council to become Executive Director of Michigan Children's Trust Fund. In this role, she has continued to be a champion for the children of our region – and across the state.

We are honored to recognize Suzanne's commitment to making the Great Lakes Bay Region a better place for children – and to officially name the Child Advocate of the Year award after her.
